### Specialist Courses for Economics Undergraduates and Postgraduates

Taught by our world-leading academics, these courses will provide a thorough grounding in these exciting areas of economics.

Courses are the equivalent of a 15 CAT module from an undergraduate degree. In the European system, it is worth 7.5 ECTS and in the US system it would be approximately equivalent to 3 credits.

This exciting course will be taught in a non-technical way and will provide a sound knowledge of the key principles of Economics. This course is open to anyone who is curious about Economics.
